plants which might have been found in early gardens in our area. You'll find an heirloom Yellow Bellflower apple tree which was a popular orchard tree in the 1800's and eight different Old Garden Roses which are known prior to 1867. The past growing season the garden provided over 200 pounds of garden produce donations to the Issaquah Food Bank. Plan a visit during the upcoming growing season and enjoy this new treasure. Parking is available close to the garden.
